Stop Line 3 - July 20, 2021

Huge thanks to Indivisible St. Paul for this action.

Description of the Issue:

Enbridge's Line 3 pipeline is going through untouched wetlands and the treaty territory of Anishinaabe peoples, through the Mississippi River headwaters to the shore of Lake Superior. The proposed new Line 3 carries up to 915,000 barrels per day of one of the dirtiest fuels on earth, tar sands crude. Every other state agency that has reviewed the project



has expressed serious concerns. The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency has serious concerns. Experts from the UofM indicate that this amount of water removal would have an adverse impact on water tables and threaten the wild rice beds - especially during a drought.

Recent Actions:

- Governor Walz has not taken forceful steps to stop the pipeline construction.
- Enbridge requested amended water permit from the DNR for 5 BILLION gallons of water on top of original 510 Million.
- UPDATE JULY 16: DNR pulled water permits due to drought, including Enbridge's ability to drill under the Shell River - BUT THEY ARE DOING IT ANYWAY!
